RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE APPOINTMENT, POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE LICENSING BOARD OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

1 *Resolved*, That a special unpaid commission, con-  
2 sisting of two members of the senate to be designated  
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house  
4 of representatives to be designated by the speaker  
5 thereof, and two persons to be appointed by the gov-  
6 ernor, with the advice and consent of the council, and  
7 two persons to be appointed by the mayor of the city  
8 of Boston, is hereby established for the purpose of  
9 making an investigation and study of the advisa-  
10 bility of reorganizing the licensing board of the city  
11 of Boston, of providing for the appointment of mem-  
12 bers thereof by the mayor of said city, and of pro-  
13 viding for the appointment of investigators for said  
14 board with full police powers. Said commission may

15 expend for expenses and clerical and other assistance  
16 such sums, not exceeding, in the aggregate,  
17 dollars, as may hereafter be appropriated. Said  
18 commission shall report to the general court the  
19 results of its investigation and study, and its recom-  
20 mendations, if any, together with drafts of legisla-  
21 tion necessary to carry said recommendations into  
22 effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house  
23 of representatives on or before the first Wednesday  
24 of December in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-  
25 one.
