### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RENTAL AND OCCUPANCY OF STATE OR MUNICIPALLY AIDED HOUSING PROJECTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 No person, board or other duly organized agency  
2 or office having anything to do with the rental or  
3 occupancy of any state or municipally aided housing  
4 project shall in any way discriminate against, or deny  
5 the application of any person seeking to rent or  
6 occupy any part of such project, because of the race,  
7 creed, color or national origin of such applicant.
