AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE RAISING OF THE STANDARDS OF THE LAWRENCE F. QUIGLEY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The trustees of the Soldiers' Home in Chelsea shall
- 2 include in their budget the necessary funds to provide
- 3 for the designation of the Lawrence F. Quigley
- 4 Memorial Hospital as a general medical and surgical
- 5 hospital.

The Committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of the 10th inst. in relation to the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States, and to inform you that the same has been referred to the appropriate committee for their consideration.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 2, Clause 3

The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

But no Representative shall be chosen for a longer Term than two Years; and no Person shall be Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years since he attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and seven Years since he became seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and, when elected, be seven Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.

The House shall have the sole Power of Impeachment. The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments, when sitting on that Purpose, and when the Senate is on that Purpose, the President shall sit with them, and shall have no Vote. A Majority of the Senate shall constitute a Quorum to try Impeachments. Judgment shall be rendered by the Senate, with or without Concurrence of the President, and shall extend to the Parties only, and not to their Offenses; but the Impeachment of any Judge shall be a Disqualification to hold any Office under the United States, and that of any Officer shall be a Disqualification to hold any Office of Honor, Trust or Profit under the United States.
