## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-One.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SALEM TO REIMBURSE ALICE FRYE FOR MEDICAL EXPENSES INCURRED BY HER ON ACCOUNT OF INJURIES SUSTAINED BY HER SON, RICHARD FRYE IN THE SALTONSTALL SCHOOL GYMNASIUM, SALEM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a moral  
2 obligation the city of Salem may appropriate and pay  
3 to Alice Frye the sum of two hundred and ninety  
4 dollars and eighty-five cents to reimburse her for ex-  
5 penses of medical care incurred by her on account of  
6 injuries sustained on December eighteenth, nineteen  
7 hundred and forty-eight, by her minor son, Richard  
8 Frye, while a volunteer worker in the gymnasium in  
9 the Saltonstall school in Salem.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its  
2 acceptance during the current year by vote of the city  
3 council of the city of Salem, subject to the provisions of  
4 its charter, but not otherwise.

THE CONSTITUTION

Article I, Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may, at any time, by Law, make or alter such Regulations, except as to the Places of Elections.
