By Mr. Toomey of Cambridge, petition of John J. Toomey relative to the retirement of state police detective inspectors and supervisors in the Division of State Police of the Department of Public Safety. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF STATE POLICE
DETECTIVE INSPECTORS AND SUPERVISORS IN THE DI-
VISION OF STATE POLICE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC
SAFETY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out section 28B, inserted by chapter 605
3 of the acts of 1946, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following: —

5 *Section 28B.* Any provision in sections one to
6 twenty-eight, inclusive, to the contrary notwithstand-
7 ing, any state police detective inspector or supervisor
8 of detectives of the division of state police, in the
9 department of public safety, appointed under section
10 six of chapter twenty-two, who has performed service
11 for the commonwealth for not less than twenty years,
12 or has performed service for the commonwealth and
13 any municipality thereof in the aggregate for not less
14 than twenty years, shall at his own request be retired.

15 Any one retiring under the provisions of this section
16 shall receive an annual pension equal to one half of
17 the highest annual compensation received by him
18 while holding the grade held by him at the time of his
19 retirement, and an additional amount equal to one
20 per cent of said compensation for each year of service
21 after the first twenty years; provided, that the total
22 amount of such pension shall in no case exceed sixty-
23 five per cent of said compensation.
