AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE NUMBER OF SPECIAL JUSTICES OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF LOWELL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 218 of the General Laws, as
2 most recently amended by chapter 731 of the acts of
3 1949, is hereby further amended by striking out the
4 first paragraph and inserting in place thereof the fol-
5 lowing paragraph: —

6 Each district court, except the municipal court of
7 the city of Boston, the central district court of Worces-
8 ter, the district court of Springfield and the district
9 court of Lowell, shall consist of one justice and one
10 special justice. There shall be one justice and two
11 special justices in the district court of Lowell.
