By Mr. O'Dea of Lowell, petition of the Massachusetts State CIO Industrial Union Council for abolition of the "merit system" of the Employment Security Law. Labor and Industries.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-One.

AN ACT TO ABOLISH THE "MERIT SYSTEM," SO CALLED,
OF THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY ACT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 151A of the General Laws shall be amended
2 by striking out therefrom section 14, in its entirety,
3 and substituting in place thereof the following:—

4 *Section 14.* Commencing January first, nineteen
5 hundred and fifty-two each employer shall make con-
6 tributions for each year at the rate of two and seven
7 tenths per cent of so much of his pay roll as is subject
8 to this chapter; provided, that he shall make con-
9 tributions only on that part of remuneration paid by
10 him to an individual not in excess of three thousand
11 dollars with respect to employment during any calen-
12 dar year.
