RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO URGE THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION TO SET ASIDE SPECIFIC TELEVISION CHANNELS FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES.

1 *Whereas*, Television is one of the most effective
2 mediums for political, economic and educational pur-
3 poses; and

4 *Whereas*, The youth of this commonwealth and of
5 the nation generally could derive great benefit from
6 educational television broadcasts dealing with the
7 basic principles of free democratic government, the
8 arts and sciences and literature; therefore be it

9 *Resolved*, That the Congress of the United States
10 use its influence to urge the Federal Communications
11 Commission to set aside specific television channels
12 for the use of schools, educational groups and non-
13 commercial organizations for educational purposes;
14 and be it further

15 *Resolved*, That the state secretary send copies of
16 these resolutions to the President of the United States,
17 to the presiding officers of both branches of Congress,
18 and to the members thereof from this commonwealth.
