### AN ACT RE-DEFINING THE WORD "VETERAN" AS USED IN CERTAIN LAWS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32, section 1, of the General  
2 Laws, as amended, is hereby further amended by  
3 adding the following sentence after the word "defini-  
4 tion" in the last paragraph of said section:— The  
5 word "veteran" shall include persons who served in  
6 provisional training regiments of the United States  
7 in time of war or insurrection and whose last dis-  
8 charge or release from such service was under con-  
9 ditions other than dishonorable, regardless of any  
10 prior discharge or release therefrom.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 115, section 1, of the General  
2 Laws, as amended, is hereby further amended by  
3 adding a new paragraph immediately following the  
4 word "expedition" in category number 7 of the  
5 definitions of term "veteran":—  
6 "Veteran" shall include persons who served in  
7 provisional training regiments of the United States  
8 in time of war or insurrection and whose last dis-  
9 charge or release from such service was under condi-  
10 tions other than dishonorable, regardless of any prior  
11 discharge or release therefrom.
