AN ACT RELATIVE TO FREE TRANSPORTATION SERVICE OF
COMMON CARRIERS FOR TOTALLY BLIND PERSONS BE-
TWEEN POINTS WITHIN THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Section 15 of chapter 159 of the General Laws, as
2 amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the
3 end thereof the following: — , nor to a totally blind
4 person, identified by a certification of registration
5 under section nineteen of chapter sixty-nine from the
6 director of the division of the blind, if accompanied
7 by a guide.
