AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF BELCHERTOWN TO
BORROW MONEY FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. For the purposes of acquiring land for
2 and constructing a school building or for the purposes
3 of remodeling any one of the present school buildings
4 and building an addition thereto, and of originally
5 equipping and furnishing such building or addition,
6 the town of Belchertown may borrow from time to
7 time, within a period of one year from the passage
8 of this act, such sums as may be necessary, not ex-
9 ceeding, in the aggregate, two hundred and twenty-
10 five thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes
11 therefor, which shall bear on their face the words,
12 "Belchertown School Building Loan, Act of 1951."
13 Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate
14 loan, and such loans shall be paid in not more than
15 twenty years from their dates. Indebtedness incurred
16 under this act shall be in excess of the statutory
17 limit, but shall, except as herein provided, be subject
18 to chapter forty-four of the General Laws, inclusive
19 of the limitation contained in the first paragraph of
20 section seven thereof.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
