AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN EMPLOYEES ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would
2 tend to defeat its purpose, which is to make its provi-
3 sions effective forthwith, therefore it is hereby de-
4 clared to be an emergency law, necessary for the im-
5 mediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 644 of the acts of the current year is hereby
2 amended by striking out section 3 and inserting in
3 place thereof the following: —

4 *Section 3.* The provisions of this act shall apply to
5 any person who is in the service of any governmental
6 unit on or after January first, nineteen hundred and
7 fifty-one, who attains the maximum age for his group
8 during the calendar year nineteen hundred and fifty-
9 one; provided, that his application for membership
10 and option is filed with the appropriate retirement
11 board and all payments of accumulated total deduc-
12 tions are completed within six months after the effec-
13 tive date of this act.
