AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE GRANTING OF LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO RAILROAD CORPORATIONS, SHIPPING COMPANIES AND AIRLINES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General Laws is 1

hereby amended by striking out section thirteen and inserting in

place thereof the following section: 3

Section 13. A railroad or car corporation operating any line of railroad or furnishing refreshments upon railroad cars within 5

the commonwealth having dining, club, buffet or lounge cars;

the owner or operator of any vessel or shipping company carrying passengers and operating out of any port of the

commonwealth; and any airline carrying passengers and

operating out of any airport of the commonwealth may sell 10

within the commonwealth alcoholic beverages to be drunk in 11

such cars, vessels or airplanes and may be issued licenses to sell 12

alcoholic beverages, if the commission sees fit to issue a license

to such railroad, car corporation, vessel, shipping company or

airline. The fee for each such license under this section shall be 15

three hundred dollars and for each certified copy thereof five

dollars. Sales of alcoholic beverages by licensees under this

section shall be made only under such regulations as the

19 commission may prescribe. No other license shall be required

20 under this chapter for sales as authorized under this section.
