## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

### AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF SCHOOL AID TO CITIES AND TOWNS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 2 of chapter 70 of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by chapter 766 of the acts of 1972, is  
3 hereby further amended by striking out paragraph (d) and  
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —  
5 (d) "School aid percentage", for each city or town, the  
6 amount by which one hundred percent exceeds the product, to  
7 the nearest tenth of one percent, of sixty percent times the  
8 valuation percentage; provided that, in applying the school aid  
9 formula under section four, the maximum percentage of state  
10 support shall be seventy-five percent and the minimum shall be  
11 fifteen percent.
