By Mr. Scibelli of Springfield, petition of Anthony M. Scibelli that persons sixty-two years of age or over be granted free tuition at state and community colleges. Education.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT PERSONS OVER SIXTY-TWO YEARS OF AGE SHALL NOT BE CHARGED TUITION AT STATE AND COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 69 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 7E the following section: —
- 3 *Section 7F.* There shall be no charge for tuition to any person
- 4 sixty-two years of age or over, who is enrolled in a state college
- 5 or a regional community college.
