

By Mr. Freeman of Chelmsford, petition of Bruce N. Freeman that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be directed to issue rules and regulations for the issuance of reject windshield stickers for improperly equipped motor vehicles. Public Safety.

AN ACT ALLOWING THE REGISTRAR OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO PROVIDE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF REJECT WINDSHIELD STICKERS FOR IMPROPERLY EQUIPPED MOTOR VEHICLES, AND FOR THE REMOVAL THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 7A of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by chapter 423 of the acts of 1973, is hereby
3 further amended by adding at the end thereof the following
4 sentence: — Such rules and regulations shall provide for the
5 issuance of a windshield sticker, so-called, stating “reject”, to the
6 owner or person in control of every motor vehicle so inspected
7 and found to be improperly equipped and for the display of such
8 sticker on the windshield of each vehicle so inspected and found
9 to be improperly equipped and that the owner or person in
10 control of such motor vehicle found to be improperly equipped,
11 and so issued a “reject” sticker shall have seven days from the
12 date of issuance of such “reject” sticker to have such motor
13 vehicle inspected and found to be properly equipped and issued
14 an approved windshield sticker.
