In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR UNIFORMED POLICE TO PATROL PUBLIC HOUSING PROJECTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. All public housing projects shall have uniform-
2 ed police twenty-four hours per day for patrol and security
3 purposes.

1 SECTION 2. There shall be one policeman per each fifty
2 families.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on January first,
2 nineteen hundred and seventy-six.
