AN ACT TO REPEAL THE RACIAL IMBALANCE LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Sections thirty-seven C and thirty-seven D of
2 chapter seventy-one of the General Laws are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. Sections one I, one J, and one K of chapter 15
2 of the General Laws are hereby repealed.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE BUDGET

ON THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1966

The Committee on the Budget has the honor to report to the House of Representatives on the budget for the fiscal year 1966. The budget is a statement of the Government's financial plan for the coming year, and it is the responsibility of the Congress to review and approve it.

The budget for 1966 is based on the assumption that the economy will continue to grow at a steady pace. It provides for a total of \$100 billion in expenditures, of which \$70 billion is for the Federal Government and \$30 billion is for the States and local governments. The budget also provides for a total of \$10 billion in new borrowing, of which \$5 billion is for the Federal Government and \$5 billion is for the States and local governments.

The Committee believes that the budget for 1966 is a sound and responsible plan for the coming year. It provides for a balanced budget, and it is in line with the long-term goals of the Government. The Committee recommends that the House of Representatives approve the budget for the fiscal year 1966.
