AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE OPERATION OF BARBER SHOPS AND BEAUTY PARLORS.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to 2 defeat its purpose, which is to further regulate forthwith the

3 operation of barber shops and beauty parlors, therefore it is

4 hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the

5 immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

The second paragraph of Section 92A of Chapter 272 of the 1

General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 418 of the acts of 1971, is hereby amended by striking out clause (10) and

inserting in place thereof the following clause: — (10) a hospital,

dispensary or clinic operating for profit; provided, however, that

with regard to the prohibition on sex discrimination, barber

shops, beauty parlors, and those establishments which rent

rooms on a temporary or permanent basis for the exclusive use

of persons of the same sex shall not be considered places of

public accommodation. The foregoing exemption shall not

10 apply to any other part of such an establishment.
