**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO INCREASING THE REGISTRATION PERIOD FOR A SNOWMOBILE OR A RECREATIONAL VEHICLE REGISTRATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Paragraph two, section 22 of chapter 90B of the  
2 General Laws as appearing in section 2, chapter 589 of the acts  
3 of 1970 is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and  
4 inserting in place thereof the following sentence: —

5 Such registration shall be valid for a period ending two years  
6 from the date of issuance, unless surrendered, suspended or  
7 revoked.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 22 of chapter 90B of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out paragraph 3 and  
3 inserting in place thereof the following: —

4 The fee for initial registration of each such vehicle and for  
5 each renewal thereof, other than vehicles for which application  
6 is made by a manufacturer or dealer as hereinafter  
7 provided, shall be ten dollars, except that no fee shall be  
8 collected for the registration of any such vehicle owned by the  
9 commonwealth or any political subdivision thereof.

1 SECTION 3. Said section 22 of chapter 90B of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out paragraph 6 and  
3 inserting in place thereof the following: —

4 The fee for initial registration of recreation vehicles or snow  
5 vehicles owned by or under the control of a manufacturer or  
6 dealer and for each renewal thereof shall be twenty-five dollars  
7 for one year and for each such number assigned and for the  
8 renewal thereof ten dollars for two years.

1 SECTION 4. Paragraph 2, section 23 of chapter 90B of the  
2 General Laws as appearing in section 2, chapter 589 of the acts  
3 of 1970 is hereby amended by striking out said paragraph and  
4 inserting in place thereof the following: —

5 A person who returns his said vehicle certificate to the  
6 director because of transfer of ownership shall be eligible for a  
7 new certificate upon application to the division for a new vehicle  
8 registration for the balance of the registration period for a fee of  
9 one dollar.
