The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO COORDINATING ALL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission to consist of one
2 member of the senate, three members of the house of
3 representatives, the secretary of public safety or his designee, a
4 representative of the Massachusetts Police Chiefs Association
5 and one person to be appointed by the governor, is hereby
6 established for the purpose of making an investigation and study
7 relative to coordinating the efforts of all law enforcement
8 agencies in the commonwealth in an effort to combat more
9 effectively organized crime, criminal activity, and other
10 violations of law through unified action.

11 Said commission may require by summons the attendance and
12 the testimony under oath of witnesses. Said commission may
13 call upon officials of the commonwealth or its various
14 subdivisions, and may also call upon officials of the federal
15 government and its various agencies and departments for such
16 information as it may desire in the course of its investigation
17 and study. Said commission may accept and expend any
18 appropriations, grants or gifts of money, professional services,
19 consultant services, clerical and other services and supplies from
20 the federal or state government or any other private source in
21 the course of its investigation and study.

Resolved, That the Committee on the Judiciary be and they are authorized to report to the House the following bill:

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following title be and the same shall be the title of an act to be known as the "Act to amend the several Acts relating to the duties of the Secretary of the Treasury":
