Chap.313 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WAKEFIELD TO PAY A CERTAIN SUM OF MONEY TO ANTONIO MUCCIO ON ACCOUNT OF INJURIES SUSTAINED.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation, the town of Wakefield is hereby authorized to pay to Antonio Muccio of said town a sum of money not exceeding three thousand dollars in settlement of a claim of said Muccio against said town on account of certain injuries sustained by him while doing work in return for welfare relief received from the board of public welfare of said town.

SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted to the registered voters of said town at the annual town meeting in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-seven in the form of the following question, which shall be placed on the official ballot to be used for the election of town officers at said meeting:— “Shall an act passed by the general court in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-six, entitled ‘An Act authorizing the town of Wakefield to pay a certain sum of money to Antonio Muccio on account of injuries sustained’, be accepted?” If a majority of the votes cast thereon are in the affirmative this act shall thereupon take effect, but not otherwise.

SECTION 3. If a majority of the votes cast on the question submitted under authority of section two is in the affirmative, any vote to make an appropriation for the purposes of section one shall be taken at an annual town meeting of said town.

Chap.314 AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE PRACTICE OF BARBERING AND THE CONDUCTING OF BARBER SHOPS, BARBER SCHOOLS AND BARBER COLLEGES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section eighty-seven H of chapter one hundred and twelve of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section two of chapter two hundred and sixty of the acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-four, is hereby further amended by striking out the last sentence and inserting in place thereof the following:— Before any registered barber opens a barber shop he shall apply to the board for the inspection and approval thereof, and the board shall collect a fee of five dollars for each such inspection, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 87H.* Any person desiring to obtain a certificate of registration shall make application to the board therefor, pay to the secretary thereof a fee of
