RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO PROFESSIONAL MALPRACTICE INSURANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 *Resolved.* That a special commission, to consist of two
2 members of the Senate, three members of the House of
3 Representatives, and six persons to be appointed by the
4 Governor, including two representatives of companies writing
5 professional malpractice insurance in the Commonwealth, two
6 Independent insurance agents, one representative of the
7 Massachusetts Medical Society and one representative of the
8 Insurance Department, is hereby established for the purpose of
9 making an investigation and study of professional malpractice
10 insurance, within the Commonwealth. Said commission may
11 travel without the Commonwealth, and may require the
12 attendance and testimony of witnesses under oath and the
13 production of books, records and papers.
