**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE REPRESENTATION FOR LOW INCOME PEOPLE AND MINORITY GROUPS ON THE METROPOLITAN AREA PLANNING COUNCIL.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 24 of chapter 40B of the General Laws  
2 as amended by chapter 849 of the acts of 1970, is further  
3 amended by striking out the words on line 8 following the word  
4 "number" and all the words to the word "so" on line 9 and  
5 inserting in place thereof the words: —at least seven shall be  
6 either black, Spanish-speaking or low-income people as  
7 qualified by income for admission to public housing in their city  
8 or town within the council district.

1 SECTION 2. Section 28 of chapter 40B of the General Laws  
2 as amended by chapter 849 of the acts of 1970, is further  
3 amended by inserting between the second and third sentence the  
4 following sentence: — In any case, at least six members of the  
5 committee shall be black, Spanish-speaking or low-income  
6 people as qualified for admission to public housing in their city  
7 or town within the council district.
