AN ACT TO CLARIFY ELIGIBILITY OF PRIVATE SCHOOL STUDENTS IN OBTAINING PUBLIC SCHOOL TEXTBOOKS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 1196 of the acts of 1973 is hereby amended by adding
2 after the words "section one of chapter seventy-six" the
3 following: — and which does not discriminate in its entrance
4 requirements on the basis of race, creed, color, sex or ability to
5 pay tuition costs.

Whereas the public lands of the United States are being disposed of in severalty to the individual owners thereof, and it is the policy of the Government to encourage the development of these lands for the benefit of the people of the United States;

Therefore, I, the President of the United States, do hereby certify that the following is a true and correct copy of the act of Congress approved July 1, 1916, and the amendments thereto, as they have since been amended, and that the same shall be observed and executed by all persons to whom these presents shall come.
