AN ACT CREATING AN ELECTED STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The State Board of Education shall consist of twelve members,
- 2 one member to be elected from each of the twelve congressional
- 3 districts. Members shall be elected at the state election and serve
- 4 two-year terms. Nomination shall be in the state primaries and
- 5 nomination papers shall contain one thousand signatures.
- 6 All provisions of the General Laws relating to the powers and
- 7 duties of the State Board of Education shall remain in effect.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW RELATIVE TO THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION.

Enacted by the People of the State of New York, January 1, 1922.

SECTION 1. The following sections of the Education Law are amended:

Section 10. The following shall constitute the powers and duties of the Commissioner of Education:

1. To examine and report to the Board of Regents the condition of the public schools of this State, and to make such recommendations as he may deem proper to the Board of Regents for the improvement of the same.
