By Mr. Hogan of Everett, petition of David J. Lucey (Registrar of Motor Vehicles) and William F. Hogan relative to the storage and sale of unclaimed motor vehicles. Government Regulations.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

### AN ACT PERTAINING TO STORAGE AND SALE OF UNCLAIMED VEHICLES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 39A of chapter 255 is hereby amended by striking out  
2 the second sentence of the fifth paragraph and inserting in place  
3 thereof the following new sentence:—If the owner does not  
4 claim the vehicle within said twenty-one days, the owner of the  
5 garage may sell said motor vehicle at public sale after publishing  
6 notice of such sale for three successive weeks in a newspaper  
7 published or having a circulation in the city or town in which  
8 the property is located; provided that he shall notify the chief of  
9 police in the city or town in which the garage is located and the  
10 Registrar of Motor Vehicles on a form prescribed by said  
11 Registrar at least five days prior to such sale that the vehicle is  
12 to be sold.
