AN ACT TO INCREASE THE FINES FOR THE FIGHTING OF BIRDS, DOGS AND OTHER ANIMALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 94 of chapter 272 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by
3 striking out, in line 5, the words "two hundred" and inserting in
4 place thereof the following:—one thousand.

1 SECTION 2. Section 95 of said chapter 272, as so appearing,
2 is hereby amended by striking out, in line 5, the words "twenty-
3 five" and inserting in place thereof the following:—two hundred
4 and fifty.
