AN ACT FURTHER DEFINING 'ELIGIBILITY FOR UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 24 of chapter 151A of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by striking out clause (a), as appearing in
3 section 1 of chapter 899 of the acts of 1973, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following clause:—

5 (a) Have been paid wages in his base period of not less than
6 twelve hundred dollars AND HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED IN
7 COVERED EMPLOYMENT FOR A PERIOD OF NOT
8 LESS THAN TWENTY-SIX WEEKS.

1 SECTION 2. Section 2J of said chapter 151 is hereby
2 amended by adding the following clause:—

3 (g) For the duration of any period, but in no case more than
4 ten weeks, in which he is not available for work within the
5 commonwealth, unless he was employed for a period of at least
6 four weeks in his new jurisdiction of residence.
