AN ACT REQUIRING THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO MEET TWICE YEARLY IN FRAMINGHAM, LOWELL AND CAMBRIDGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 34, Section 9 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 431 of the Acts of 1908, is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the eleventh paragraph and inserting in
4 its place: — At Cambridge, twice yearly; at Lowell, twice yearly;
5 at Framingham twice yearly.

The Committee on the subject of the
 proposed amendments to the
 Constitution of the United States
 have the honor to report to the
 House of Representatives the
 following amendments to the
 Constitution of the United States
 which they deem to be
 necessary and proper for
 the better government of
 the United States.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I. Section 2. Clause 3.

The number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty thousand persons; but each State shall have at least one Representative, and until 1820, not less than two.

The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

No Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years Residence in the United States, and who, when elected, shall not, when he takes the Oath or Affirmation, have seven Years Residence in that State in which he shall be chosen.
