

HOUSE No. 4840

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

AN ACT VALIDATING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AND ACTIONS OF THE MORNINGDALE WATER DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The establishment of the Morningdale Water
2 District and all proceedings heretofore taken by said district or
3 its officers or the inhabitants of said district relative to the
4 acceptance of chapter four hundred and nineteen of the acts of
5 nineteen hundred and forty-nine and the establishment and
6 organization of said district are hereby validated and confirmed
7 and said district is hereby declared to be, and at all times since
8 its establishment to have been, a valid district with all the rights,
9 powers and duties prescribed by said chapter four hundred and
10 nineteen.

1 SECTION 2. All proceedings heretofore taken by the
2 Morningdale Water District are hereby validated and confirmed.

1 SECTION 3. All votes heretofore passed by the Morningdale
2 Water District are hereby validated and confirmed.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

SECTION 1. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, elected by the Legislature thereof; and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

SECTION 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years since he attained to the Age of twenty one Years, and seven Years since he became a Citizen, and when he shall be elected, he shall have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when he shall be elected, he shall have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when he shall be elected, he shall have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States.

SECTION 3. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

SECTION 4. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall begin at noon on the 3d day of January, but they may adjourn to such other Day within the same Year as they think proper.

SECTION 5. The Congress shall have Power to regulate the Commerce with foreign Nations, to regulate Commerce among the several States, and to regulate Commerce with the Indian Tribes.
