AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN MUNICIPAL POSITIONS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 5 of chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the sixteenth paragraph, as most
3 recently amended by chapter 161 of the acts of 1970, and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:— Assistant
5 city or town managers, administrative assistants to city and
6 town managers, secretaries, stenographers, clerks, telephone
7 operators and messengers connected with the offices of city
8 councils, mayors, city managers, town managers and selectmen,
9 superintendents of schools, assistant superintendents of schools,
10 and school business administrators:
