### AN ACT RELATIVE TO SECURITY MEASURES IN BANKS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 167 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 adding the following section:—
- 3 *Section 63.* The commissioner shall require banks to protect
- 4 employees and customers by the use of protective ceiling to floor
- 5 partitions to enclose tellers and other bank employees.
