AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE FOR CERTAIN STATE EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause (a) of section 43 of chapter 31 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting
3 in place thereof the following sentence:— Every person holding
4 office or employment under permanent appointment in the
5 official or labor service of the commonwealth, and every person
6 who has been employed as a temporary "02" employee for a
7 continuous period of ten years in either such service, or of any
8 county, city or town thereof, shall have unlimited tenure of
9 office or employment, subject to the provisions of this chapter
10 and the rules made thereunder.
