RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO ENFORCE LEGISLATION PROHIBITING THE EMPLOYMENT OF ALIENS ENTERING THE UNITED STATES ILLEGALLY.

1 *Whereas*, The current standard of living and employment
2 opportunities of domestic workers is undermined by the
3 employment of aliens who enter the United States illegally; now
4 therefore be it

5 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts General Court respectfully
6 urges the Congress of the United States to exercise its powers in
7 enforcing the existing laws which prohibit the employment of
8 aliens who enter the United States illegally; and be it further

9 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts General Court respectfully
10 urges the Senate of the United States to enact H.R. 982; and be it
11 further

12 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be transmitted
13 forthwith by the clerk of the House of Representatives to the
14 President of the United States, the presiding officer of each
15 branch of Congress and to the members thereof from this
16 Commonwealth.
