

By Mr. Young of Scituate, petition of George C. Young and others (by vote of the town) that the town of Scituate be authorized to borrow money for the construction of a slurry trench. Local Affairs. [Local Approval Received.]

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF SCITUATE TO BORROW MONEY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SLURRY TRENCH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Town of Scituate, for the purpose of
2 constructing a Slurry Trench or water impervious barrier to
3 prevent the passage of ground water from a certain parcel of land
4 which is to become a sanitary landfill area into a certain well
5 located on a contiguous parcel of land or into the ground water
6 supplying said well for the protection of public water supply,
7 water flowage rights, and the public water system, is hereby
8 authorized to borrow such sums as may be necessary, not
9 exceeding in the aggregate, three hundred twenty thousand
10 dollars, and may issued bonds and notes therefor which shall bear
11 on their face the words, "Town of Scituate Slurry Trench Loan
12 Act of 1975." Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate
13 loan and such loans shall be paid within thirty years from their
14 dates. Indebtedness incurred under this Act shall be in excess of
15 any statutory limit, but shall, except as provided herein, be
16 subject to Chapter 44 of the General Laws, exclusive of any
17 limitation or requirement contained in Section 7 or 8 thereof.

1 SECTION 2. The action taken by the Town of Scituate under
2 Article 9 of the warrant of the Special Town Meeting held on
3 February 3 and 4, 1975, is hereby validated and confirmed in all

4 respects and the Treasurer of said Town, with the approval of the
5 Board of Selectmen, may issue bonds or notes pursuant to
6 Section 1 of this Act.

1 SECTION 3. Said Treasurer with the approval of the
2 Selectmen may also make temporary loans under the provisions
3 of Section 17 of Chapter 44 of the General Laws in anticipation of
4 the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by Section 1.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
