AN ACT RELATIVE TO SURVIVORS BENEFITS FOR CERTAIN FULL-TIME STUDENTS UNDER THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Paragraph (b) of subdivision (2) of section 26 of 2 chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out 3 clause (iii), as most recently amended by chapter 451 of the acts of 4 1961, and inserting in place thereof the following clause: — (iii) A 5 yearly amount of additional pension at the rate of three hundred 6 and twelve dollars for each surviving unmarried child of such 7 member under the age of eighteen or over said age and physically 8 or mentally incapacitated from earning on and after the date such 9 illness was incurred or injury sustained. Such additional pension 10 on account of any such child shall be paid only so long as such 11 child survives, remains unmarried and is under age eighteen or, if 12 over said age, remains physically or mentally incapacitated from 13 earning or, if over said age and under age twenty-one, is a full-14 time student at an accredited educational institution. The words 15 "full-time student" shall mean a child who is in full-time 16 attendance in an accredited educational institution offering full-17 time courses of study equivalent to or higher than secondary 18 school study. The words "accredited educational institution" shall 19 mean any school, college, or university that is licensed, approved, 20 or accredited, as the case may be, in the state in which it is 21 located.

SECTION 2. The provisions of section one of this act shall 2 take effect as of January first, nineteen hundred and seventy-five,

3 and shall apply to any child who has been receiving children's 4 benefits as the result of the disability or death, as the case may be,

5 of a member which occurred prior to January first, nineteen

6 hundred and seventy-five.
