**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

AN ACT ALLOWING JUSTICES, CLERKS AND ASSISTANT CLERKS OF THE JUVENILE COURTS TO ACCRUE VACATION DAYS AND SICK LEAVE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 58 of chapter 218  
2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the first  
3 sentence the following two sentences: — Each justice of a juvenile  
4 court shall be entitled to thirty days vacation and thirty days sick  
5 leave in each calendar year. Vacation leave and sick leave not  
6 used in any such year may be accumulated, provided that the  
7 total number of vacation days so accumulated shall not exceed  
8 sixty and the total amount of sick leave accumulated shall not  
9 exceed one hundred and eighty days.

1 SECTION 2. The first paragraph of section 58 of chapter 218  
2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the  
3 third sentence the following two sentences; — Each clerk of the  
4 juvenile court shall be entitled to thirty days vacation and thirty  
5 days sick leave in each calendar year. Vacation leave and sick  
6 leave not used in any such year may be accumulated, provided  
7 that the total number of vacation days so accumulated shall not  
8 exceed sixty and the total amount of sick leave accumulated shall  
9 not exceed one hundred and eighty days.
