HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, November 12, 1975.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom were referred the Bill further regulating petitions for leave to request hearings from orders or reviews from decisions under the workmen's compensation act (Senate, No. 277, changed); the Bill limiting rates on home mortgages and requiring the licensing of certain lenders by the Commissioner of Banks (Senate, No. 1827); the Bill to increase the rate of interest for failing to pay contributions timely under the Employment Security Law (House, No. 153); the Bill providing for permanent partial compensation under the workmen's compensation law (House, No. 169); the residue of the Bill requiring the appointment of a representative of labor to the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency and representative of Massachusetts Council of Older Americans (House, No. 523); the Bill requiring competitive bidding in the letting of certain contracts by gas and electric companies (House, No. 2278); the Bill requiring competitive bidding in the letting of certain contracts by telephone and telegraph companies (House, No. 2279); the Bill relative to the appointment of the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (House, No. 2785); the Bill to provide for payment of total current charges for provision of hospital intensive care and related services provided to workers covered under the Workmen's Compensation Act (House, No. 2850); the Bill prohibiting the Department of Public Utilities from authorizing a telephone corporation to charge or establish a special rate for directory assistance (House, No. 3493); the Bill relative to exclusion of certain items from operating expenses and rate base of certain public utilities (House, No. 3495, changed); the Bill providing that electric companies shall furnish the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions a combined single bill at the applicable rate therefor (House, No. 3504); the Bill making certain corrective changes in the Employment Security Law (House, No. 3805); the Bill to provide for the distribution of tax savings by public utilities (House, No. 4439, changed); the Bill relative to extending the benefit of the workmen's compensation law to certain part-time employees (House, No. 5929); the Bill establishing a Massachusetts Industrial Mortgage Insurance

Agency (House, No. 5935); the Bill relative to the administration of workmen's compensation for state employees (House, No. 5936); the Bill authorizing the Director of Standards and the inspectors of weights and measures to examine and test automated electronic retail check out systems (House, No. 5957); the Resolve authorizing the Department of Public Utilities to make an investigation of changes in the rate structures of gas and electric companies (House, No. 6009); the Bill relative to the reimbursement of liens on workmen's compensation awards (House, No. 6060); the Bill requiring mortgagees to make repairs under certain circumstances (House, No. 6109); the Bill clarifying relocation assistance requirements and payment limitations (House, No. 6271); the Bill providing for assessment and imposition of a fine or costs of investigation in any criminal action of fraud in public assistance programs (House, No. 6358); the Bill increasing the amount of compensation for incapacity under the Workmen's Compensation Act (House, No. 6366); the Bill permitting the Executive Office of Human Services to qualify as the designated state agency for Social Services under title XX of the Social Security Act (House, No. 6454); and the Bill relative to the licensing of insurance agents or brokers (House, No. 6511), report, recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6782) ought to be adopted.
