The committee on Ways and Means, to whom were referred the residue of the message from His Excellency the Governor submitting deficiency appropriations for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and seventy-five (House, No. 5639); the residue of the message from His Excellency the Governor submitting legislation recommending certain deficiency appropriations and the means for financing them (House, No. 5959); so much as relates to submitting certain deficiency appropriations (section 2); so much as relates to creating a General Obligations Fund (section 6), and transferring certain sums of money from said fund to the General Fund (section 3); so much as relates to creating a Mass Transportation Fund (section 6); so much as relates to authorizing the State Treasurer to borrow sums of money necessary to meet the transfer of money from the General Obligations Fund (section 4); so much as relates to authorizing the State Treasurer to issue and sell bonds (section 5); and so much as relates to certain allotments and expenditures (sections 26 and 27); so much of the message from His Excellency the Governor recommending legislation relative to the Department of Public Welfare (House, No. 6092); as relates to making an appropriation for the fiscal year nineteen hundred and seventy-five to supplement certain items contained in the General Appropriation Act (App. D.); the message from His Excellency the Governor submitting legislation recommending certain deficiency appropriations and the means for financing them (House, No. 6125); so much as relates to submitting certain deficiency appropriations (sections 1 and 2); so much as relates to creating a General Obligations Fund (section 6), and transferring certain sums of money from said fund to the General Fund (section 3); so much as relates to creating a Mass Transportation Fund (section 6), and relative to payments to be made from said fund (sections 7, 8 and 23); so much as relates to authorizing the State Treasurer to borrow sums of money necessary to meet the transfer from the General Obligations Fund (section 4); and so much as relates to authorizing the State Treasurer to issue and sell bonds (section 5); to whom were recommitted the Bill making ap-

appropriations for the fiscal year ending June the thirtieth, nineteen hundred and seventy-five to provide for supplementing certain existing appropriations and for certain new activities and projects (House, No. 6150); the Bill providing for payment of certain expenses to justices and special justices (Senate, No. 835); and to whom were referred the Bill to amend the name of the Probate Court and the compensation of probate judges (printed as Senate, No. 885); the Bill allowing the Commissioner of Insurance to hold hearings on fire insurance ratings upon request from cities and towns (Senate, No. 1886); the Bill providing that the law further regulating the removal of motor vehicles parked or standing on private ways or upon improved or enclosed property shall not apply to the city of Everett (Senate, No. 1922); the Bill making certain appropriations for the fiscal year nineteen hundred and seventy-six prior to action on the general appropriation bill for said year (Senate, No. 2068); the Bill making certain appropriations for the fiscal year nineteen hundred and seventy-six prior to action on the general appropriation bill for said year (Senate, No. 2076, amended); the Bill directing the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority to convey certain land to the city of Everett (House, No. 1621); the Resolve increasing the scope of the special commission established to make an investigation and study relative to setting up a public employment program for unemployed persons (House, No. 5618); the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2015) of Daniel J. Foley for legislation to direct the Treasurer and Receiver General of the Commonwealth to expend certain funds; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 828) of Edward J. Early, Jr., relative to removing the limitation on the earnings of certain persons who are retired for disability; the petition (accompanied by resolve, House, No. 1839) of John G. King for the payment from the state treasury of a certain sum of money to the widow of Stanley Walor, a former employee of the Department of Mental Health, for unused sick leave; the petition (accompanied by resolve, House, No. 2039) of John G. King for the payment from the state treasury of a certain sum of money to Lloyd Potter and Sydney Porter for certain work performed at the Essex Agricultural and Industrial Institute; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 6342) of H. Thomas Colo for legislation relative to making appropriations for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen

hundred and seventy-five to provide for supplementing certain existing appropriations and for certain new activities and projects, report recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6799) ought to be adopted.
