

By Mr. Cole of Lexington, petition of Lincoln P. Cole, Jr. (by vote of the town) relative to the granting of licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages by certain restaurants in the town of Lexington. Government Regulations.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE GRANTING OF LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY CERTAIN RESTAURANTS IN THE TOWN OF LEXINGTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The state secretary shall cause to be placed on
2 the official ballot used in the town of Lexington at each
3 biennial state election the following subdivision to the ques-
4 tion which he is required under the provisions of section
5 eleven of chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General
6 Laws to place on the official ballot in all cities and towns at
7 such elections, to wit:—

8 E. Shall licenses be granted in the town of Lexington for
9 the sale therein of all alcoholic beverages by restaurants
10 having a dining room capacity of not less
11 than than ninety-nine persons?

12 If a majority of the votes cast in said city in answer to
13 subdivision D is in the negative and a majority of the votes
14 cast in answer to subdivision E is in the affirmative, said city
15 shall, irrespective of the results of the votes in answer to
16 subdivisions B, C, and D, be taken to authorize for the two
17 calendar years next succeeding, the sale in said city of all
18 alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises of restaur-
19 ants having a dining room capacity of not less than ninety-
20 nine persons. Said licenses shall be subject, however, to all
21 other provisions of said chapter one hundred and thirty-
22 eight.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
