## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Four.

### AN ACT

To provide for dredging the Reserved Channel in Boston Harbor to a Depth of not exceeding Twenty Feet.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The board of harbor and land  
2 commissioners is hereby authorized to dredge the  
3 reserved and temporary channel in Boston har-  
4 bor to a depth of not exceeding twenty feet  
5 between its junction with the main ship channel  
6 now being dredged by the United States govern-  
7 ment to the draw in the bridge on L street at an  
8 expense not exceeding seventy-five thousand dol-  
9 lars, and to apply to the payment of such expense  
10 such part of the unexpended balance of the Com-  
11 monwealth's flats improvement fund established  
12 by chapter two hundred and thirty-seven of the  
13 acts of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-  
14 eight as they may deem expedient.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
