AN ACT

To extend the Provisions of the Fifty-eight Hour Law so as to Include the Month of December.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first sentence of section twenty-three of
2 chapter one hundred and six of the Revised Laws
3 is hereby amended by striking out all after the
4 word "week," in the third line, to and including
5 the word "retail," in the fifth line, so that the
6 sentence will read as follows:—

7 *Section 23.* No child under eighteen years of
8 age and no woman shall be employed in laboring
9 in a mercantile establishment for more than fifty-
10 eight hours in a week.
