Introduced on leave by Senator ARWOOD of Plymouth. [Railroads.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-five.

AN ACT

Relative to the Storage of Baggage in Railroad
Stations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Every steam railroad corporation
2 maintaining a terminal passenger station in the
3 city of Boston shall maintain on the first floor of
4 such station and adjacent to the main waiting
5 room, a suitable package or parcel room, to which
6 room parcels, bundles or bags, which can be car-
7 ried by hand may be sent, and the same shall be
8 received, kept and delivered by the corporation
9 to passengers, and no charge shall be made there-
10 for if called for within twenty-four hours, but a

11 charge not exceeding five cents a day may be
12 made for each succeeding day or fractional part
13 thereof for each package. Such room shall be
14 open for the reception and delivery of such pack-
15 ages, bundles and bags from seven o'clock A.M.
16 to ten o'clock P.M. daily, but such packages, par-
17 cels or bags shall be received or delivered at any
18 other time when the room is open.

1 SECT. 2. Every steam railroad corporation
2 neglecting to comply with the provisions of this
3 act shall be punished by a fine of not less than
4 one nor more than twenty dollars for each day
5 such neglect continues.
