## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-two.

### AN ACT

To Incorporate the Trustees of the College Shakespearean Club of the Massachusetts Agricultural College.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Samuel C. Damon, Joseph B.  
2 Lindsey, Joel E. Goldthwait, James M. Marsh,  
3 Frederick H. Fowler, Robert B. Moore, their  
4 associates and successors, are made a corporation  
5 by the name of the Trustees of the college  
6 Shakespearean club of the Massachusetts agri-  
7 cultural college, for the purpose of holding and  
8 managing the real and personal estate of the col-  
9 lege Shakespearean club of the Massachusetts  
10 agricultural college, with the powers and subject  
11 to the duties, liabilities and restrictions set forth  
12 in all general laws which now are or hereafter  
13 may be in force and applicable to such corpora-  
14 tions.

1    SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and  
2 personal estate for the uses of the above-named  
3 club to an amount not exceeding twenty thousand  
4 dollars, which shall not be exempt from taxation.

1    SECT. 3. The number of trustees of said cor-  
2 poration shall never exceed seven, and any vacan-  
3 cies occurring in said board of trustees shall be  
4 filled by election by the graduate and undergrad-  
5 uate members of the above-named club.

1    SECT. 4. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
