AN ACT

Concerning the Salary of the Late Nicholas A.
Apollonio City Registrar of the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The city of Boston is authorized
2 to pay to the widow of Nicholas A. Apollonio
3 late city registrar of said city, the amount of sal-
4 ary to which he would have been entitled had he
5 lived and continued to hold his office until the
6 first day of May in the year eighteen hundred and
7 ninety-two.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
