AN ACT

To authorize the Town of Arlington to Incur Indebtedness for the Purpose of Erecting a High School Building.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Arlington may incur
2 indebtedness for the purpose of erecting a high
3 school building, in said town, to an amount not
4 exceeding the limit of indebtedness fixed by law
5 for said town, and may from time to time issue
6 negotiable notes, bonds or scrip therefor, prop-
7 erly denominated on the face thereof, payable in
8 periods not exceeding twenty years from the
9 date of issue; but the provisions of chapter
10 twenty-nine of the Public Statutes and of chap-
11 ter one hundred and twenty-nine of the acts of
12 the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four shall

13 otherwise apply to the issue of such bonds, notes
14 or scrip, and to the establishment of a sinking
15 fund for the payment thereof at maturity.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
