RESOLVE

In favor of William Burt.

1 *Resolved*, That William Burt of Taunton, Massachu-
2 setts, father of Jerome B. Burt, who served to the credit
3 of this state, in company G, fourth regiment of Massa-
4 chusetts infantry, during the war of the rebellion, and
5 who died in said service, shall, from and after the
6 passage of this resolve, be eligible to receive state aid
7 under the provisions, rules and limitations of chapter
8 three hundred and one of the acts of the year eighteen
9 hundred and eighty-nine, in the same manner and to the
10 same extent he would have been, had he drawn state
11 aid in eighteen hundred and sixty-six, by virtue of then
12 existing law.
