RESOLUTION

Requiring the Railroad Commissioners to inquire into the
Subject of Interchangeable Mileage Tickets.

1 *Resolved*, That the board of railroad commissioners are
2 hereby directed to inquire into the general subject of
3 requiring each railroad corporation operating any rail-
4 road in this Commonwealth to accept, in payment of
5 fares on such railroad, mileage tickets issued by other
6 railroad corporations operating railroads in this Com-
7 monwealth; and to report to the next general court
8 whether it is feasible and expedient to require corpora-
9 tions to accept tickets not issued by them.
