AN ACT

To protect the Beaches and Shores of the Town of
Marblehead.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Whoever takes or removes by land
2 or water from any beach, shore, bluff, headland or
3 bar within the limits of the town of Marblehead
4 any stones, gravel, mud or other material com-
5 posing such beach, shore, bluff, headland or bar,
6 without the consent in writing of the board of
7 harbor and land commissioners shall for each
8 offense forfeit and pay to the use of the Common-
9 wealth a sum not less than one hundred dollars
10 nor more than five hundred dollars, or be pun-
11 ished by imprisonment in jail not exceeding six
12 months.

1 SECT. 2. Any person found violating the pro-
2 visions of this act may be arrested without war-
3 rant by any constable of the town of Marblehead
4 or by any officer qualified to serve criminal
5 process, and may be detained by such constable
6 or officer not exceeding twenty-four hours, Sun-
7 days and legal holidays excepted; at or before
8 the expiration of which time such person shall be
9 brought before a court or magistrate having juris-
10 diction in the case and proceeded against accord-
11 ing to law.
